



# Nature and Characteristics of Women Informal Employment in Sri Lanka

Women play a critical role in the Sri Lankan economy forming the backbone of several economically important sectors in the country e.g. tea, garment sector, and migrant workers. However, in certain sectors women face precarious working environments and lack of access to social security systems. Therefore, understanding the situation of women in the informal sector is the first step towards breeding safe grounds for women involved in forms of informal employment. Hence, this study looks at the extent and socio-economic characteristics of informal employment with special focus on women by analyzing micro level Labour Force Survey data (2019) using descriptive statistical analysis.
