

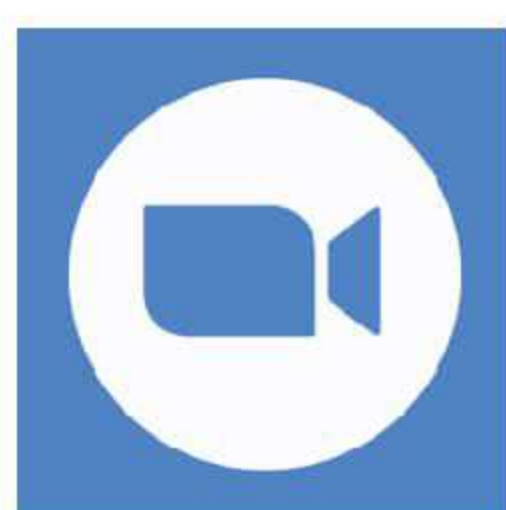

The concept of communication is ancient. The earliest communication model was the initiative of the great philosopher Aristotle. This model was proposed before 300 B.C. and was called the Aristotle Model of Communication. The Aristotle Model of Communication is formed on five basic elements: the speaker, the speech, the occasion, the audience, and the effect. It includes all four skills of speaking listening reading and writing. However, the primary focus is on speaking.
